

Emergency Comms & Power Checklist

In a crisis, staying powered and connected is critical. This checklist focuses on communication tools and power sources to keep you informed, coordinated, and charged during outages or off-grid situations.

Communication Tools

- Battery-powered AM/FM or NOAA radio
- HAM radio (with license) or CB radio
- Two-way radios or walkie-talkies (FRS/GMRS)
- Phone with offline map and emergency apps

Power Sources & Charging

- Portable power bank (10,000mAh minimum)
- Solar panel charger or solar generator
- Car inverter or 12V power adapter
- Crank or pedal-powered charger (optional)

Battery & Cable Management

- Spare batteries (AA, AAA, CR123, etc.)
- Multi-port USB charger and adapters
- Cables for all critical devices (label them)
- Ziplock or dry bags for cables and batteries

Signal Boost & Info Access

- Signal booster (if in low-signal area)
- Offline survival guides and PDF documents
- Notebook with frequencies, call signs, and contacts
- Printed emergency plans and local maps

Tips & Hints:

Test radios and chargers monthly. Keep everything charged and stored together for quick deployment.

Label frequencies, power requirements, and passwords on a printed card in your kit.
